POLAND

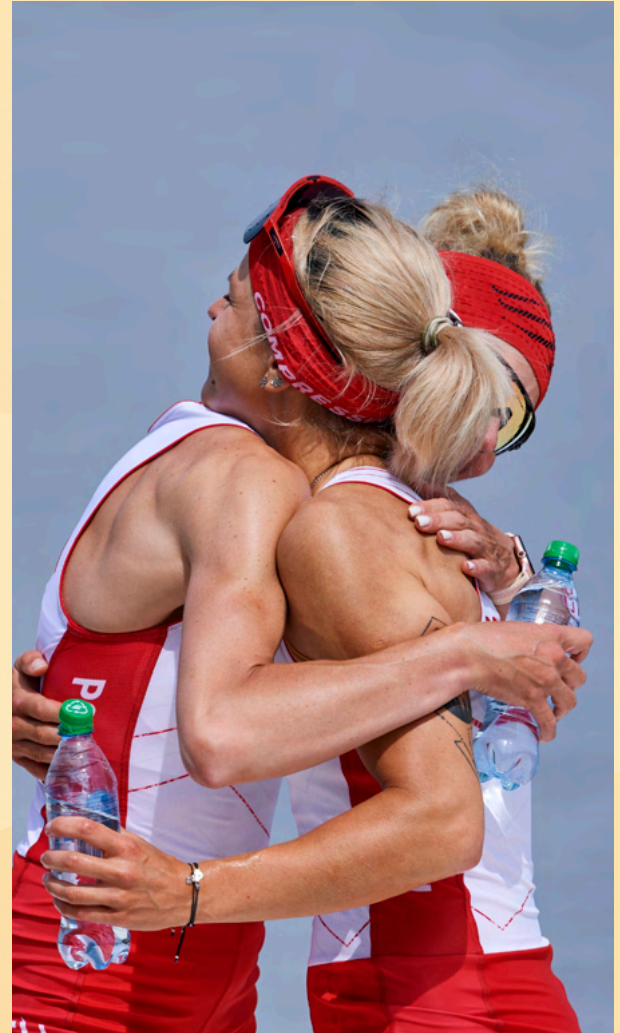
Poland is a country located in Central Europe, known for its rich history, cultural heritage, and beautiful landscapes. Its capital is Warsaw, a vibrant city that blends modernity with historical sites. Poland has a population of about 38 million people and is a member of the European Union and NATO.

The official language is Polish, and the currency is the Polish złoty (PLN). Poland's climate is temperate, with cold winters and warm summers. The country is famous for its medieval castles, picturesque old towns, and natural beauty, including the Tatra Mountains and the Masurian Lake District.

Poland has a complex history, marked by periods of partition and occupation, but it has emerged as a resilient nation. It is the birthplace of famous figures like the composer Frédéric Chopin and the scientist Marie Curie. Visitors can explore Poland's cultural heritage in cities like Kraków, Gdańsk, and Wrocław, as well as its poignant history at sites like Auschwitz-Birkenau.

Poland is known for its hearty cuisine, with dishes like pierogi (dumplings), bigos (hunter's stew), and kielbasa (sausage) being popular. The country is also recognized for its strong traditions, including celebrating Christmas and Easter with unique customs.

Overall, Poland offers a mix of historical depth, cultural richness, and natural beauty, making it an intriguing destination for travelers.





If you plan to attend the 2025 World Rowing Under 23 Championships in Poland, it's important to be aware of the visa requirements. Poland is part of the Schengen Area, so travellers from Schengen member countries do not need a visa for short stays (up to 90 days within a 180-day period).

For non-Schengen nationals, a visa may be required. You should check if your country has a visa-free agreement with the Schengen Area. If not, you'll need to apply for a Schengen visa. The application process typically involves submitting a completed form, a valid passport, recent photos, proof of accommodation, travel insurance, and evidence of sufficient funds for your stay.

Visa processing times can vary, so it's advisable to apply well in advance of your trip. Be sure to check the specific requirements at the Polish consulate or embassy in your country.

Once in Poland, make sure to carry your passport or ID with you, as authorities may request to see it. If you are unsure about the visa requirements, it's best to consult with a local Polish embassy or consulate before your travel.

Situated in western Poland, it is the second largest province in the country (with an area of nearly 30 thousand square kilometers). It has a population of about 3.5 million and the capital of the region is Poznań.

Greater Poland (Wielkopolska) lies at the junction of numerous traffic routes. The A2 Motorway leads from Poznań to both Warsaw and Berlin. From Warsaw to Berlin, there is also the EuroCity train connection via Poznań, providing a quick transportation link between the cities. The route is adapted to the high-speed European railway network. The city also has an airport, the Poznań-Ławica Airport, which belongs to the most dynamically developing ones in Poland in terms of passenger transportation.

Greater Poland is an ideal place for tourists. This beautiful region can be explored through a unique network of cycle trails winding for hundreds of kilometers. Greater Poland is also the cradle of Polish statehood. Apart from Poznań, the region is also famous for the places located on the so-called Piast Trail (Szlak Piastowski), including Ostrów Lednicki, Gniezno, Trzemeszno, Strzelno, Biskupin and Kruszwica. It is just here that the tangible evidence of the emergence of the Polish nation has survived to this day. According to recent studies, Ostrów Lednicki is the baptism place of the first Polish ruler, the duke Mieszko I of Poland, while Biskupin is a fortified settlement of the Lusatian culture. The Biskupin settlement is one of the few archaeological sites in Poland that can boast full-sized reconstructions of a rampart, breakwater, gate, streets and residential buildings.

A fascinating image of Greater Poland unfolded in the subsequent centuries, as reflected in the magnificent palaces and manor houses in the region, including Kórnik near Poznań, Rzdzyńa near Leszno, Wąsowo near Kuślin, Krzeńlice near

Pobiedziska, Porażyn near Nowy Tomyśl, Antonin near Ostrów Wielkopolski and Rogalin near Mosina. Finally, Greater Poland and its capital in Poznań, is an example of the only victorious uprising in the history of Poland which took place in 1918. The inhabitants of Greater Poland took up arms and themselves freed the region from the yoke of the occupier.

Greater Poland also offers splendid natural settings, with the National Park of Greater Poland (Wielkopolski Park Narodowy) and part of the Drawieński National Park located within the region's boundaries. There are twelve landscape parks, including the Lednicki Landscape Park, the Sierakowski Landscape Park, the Powidzki Landscape Park, the Zielonka Forest, the Rogaliński Landscape Park, the Nadwarciański Landscape Park and the Barycz Valley, to name only a few.

Greater Poland is one of the richest and most dynamically developing regions of Poland. In the region, there are nearly 40 institutions of higher education, with the biggest including the Adam Mickiewicz University in Poznań with nearly 50 thousand students, the Poznań University of Technology (20 thousand students), the Poznań University of Economics (over 10 thousand students), the University of Life Sciences in Poznań (over 11 thousand students), the Karol Marcinkowski University of Medical Sciences in Poznań (approx. 9 thousand students) and Academy of Physical Education in Poznań (approx. 5 thousand students). This place is really worth visiting to see and feel the atmosphere of Great Poland's economy and work for the region and the entire country.





The Poznań District consists of the city of Poznań and 17 surrounding communes: Buk, Czerwonak, Dopiewo, Kleszczewo, Komorniki, Kostrzyn, Kórnik, Luboń, Mosina, Murowana Goślina, Pobiedziska, Puszczykowo, Rokietnica, Stęszew, Suchy Las, Swarzędz and Tarnowo Podgórne. It is one of the largest districts in Poland and the biggest one in Greater Poland (Wielkopolska). Covering the area of 1,900 square kilometres, the district is inhabited by over 370 thousand people, thus being the most densely populated region in Poland. Most of its communes are part of the agglomeration of Poznań, which is situated at the confluence of significant national and international traffic routes.

The area of the Poznań District is covered with a relatively dense railway network of strategic importance for both passenger and freight traffic. These railway lines are regularly used by trains travelling from Poznań to such destinations as Berlin, Szczecin, Koszalin, Bydgoszcz and Gdynia, Warsaw, Katowice and Cracow, Wrocław, Wolsztyn and Wągrowiec.

The territory of the Poznań District falls within the Greater Poland Lakelands (Pojezierze Wielkopolskie), with forests covering the area of 42 thousand hectares. Hiking and biking enthusiasts are free to explore the numerous tracks and trails spread across the region. The whole area of the district is dissected by networks of hiking trails.

The Poznań District boasts many gems of architecture, including the Rogalin Palace Museum, the Kórnik Castle, the National Museum of Agriculture and Agricultural-Food Industry in Szreniawa, the Open Air Museum and Beekeeping Museum in Swarzędz, the Arkady Fiedler Museum - Literary Workshop in Puszczykowo and the Museum of Natural Environment and Hunting in Uzarszewo.

Poznań, along with the five most industrialised communes of the district, namely Czerwonak, Komorniki, Luboń, Swarzędz and Tarnowo Podgórne, form the Poznań Industrial Region. There are many production plants operating within the Poznań District, including Imperial Tobacco, Man Bus, Solaris Bus&Coach, Volkswagen Poznań to name only a few. The district also has enormous warehouse facilities of such companies as Amazon.com and Volkswagen Group Poland.





With its population of over 550 thousand, the city is a part of the most developed region of the country. It is located closer to Berlin (270 km) than Warsaw (310 km). Poznań is inhabited by people who can be relied on - well-educated, open-minded and competent. The city puts an emphasis on the technology for achieving success, based on a more than 1,000-year-long tradition of efficiency.

Poznań combines tradition and culture with modernity. We start from the roots, namely the Ostrów Tumski with its magnificent Archcathedral Basilica dating back to the very beginnings of Polish Christianity in the 5th century. Ostrów Tumski is close to the Old Market Square, with its Renaissance City Hall being the symbol of the city. It is one of the most beautiful city halls in the world, famous for the two figures of billy goats that show up for the inhabitants and visitors of Poznań every day exactly at noon. Not far from the City Hall is another wonderful monumental, though this time baroque, piece of architecture - the city parish church, with its breath-taking interior and the equally captivating façade.

Greater Poland and its capital in Poznań embody the tempestuous history of the region and the confluence of many cultures, as is tangibly evidenced by the monumental buildings of the Imperial Forum.

Across the city, there is no shortage of galleries, museums, clubs and cultural centers. A real gem, already renowned and appreciated worldwide, is the "Old Brewery" (Stary Browar) Commerce, Art and Business Centre - the artistic hub of projects from the fields of modern art, dance and design. Poznań stands out from other Polish cities due to its catalogue of cultural events organized at the world's highest level and the invariably successful ventures representing a broad spectrum of artistic activities. For many years, a real pride of the city has been the Malta International Theatre Festival - a great celebration of open-air and street theater which attracts thousands of artists and

enthusiasts to Poznań. In addition to that, Poznań is famous for the Made in Chicago Festival - the only festival in Europe featuring the Chicago school of jazz, the Animator Festival - the largest animated film festival in Poland and the EthnoPort Festival - recognized as one of the 25 best world music festivals in the world. It is also important to remember about the cultural events for the youngest visitors.

Poznań is a city of young and very active people, which makes its climate very agreeable. There are nearly 140 thousand young people studying at 26 institutions of higher education - every fourth person you encounter in Poznań is a student. It is the young people that provide the city with an amazing atmosphere on the streets, fresh ideas and lots of enthusiasm, which makes it possible to fulfill innovative scientific projects, as well as interesting artistic, sports and entertainment campaigns.

Poznań is also a city of great sporting emotions. Its inhabitants are no stranger to wonderful sports events. The capital of Greater Poland was one of the host cities of UEFA Euro 2012. For many years, Poznań has also played host to one of the biggest marathon events in our country, namely the Poznań Marathon, while the Malta Regatta Course is a regular venue for the largest international events in water sports. Next to the Regatta Course, there is a successful sports complex, known as "Maltese Baths", housing an Olympic pool.

Poznań is also famous around Europe for the passion of the fans of Lech Poznań - the best-supported football club in Poland and a seven-time Polish champion. It will be worth your while to visit Poznań and experience the history, tradition, culture, sport, business and modernity in a harmonious combination that sets the rhythm of the city's life.

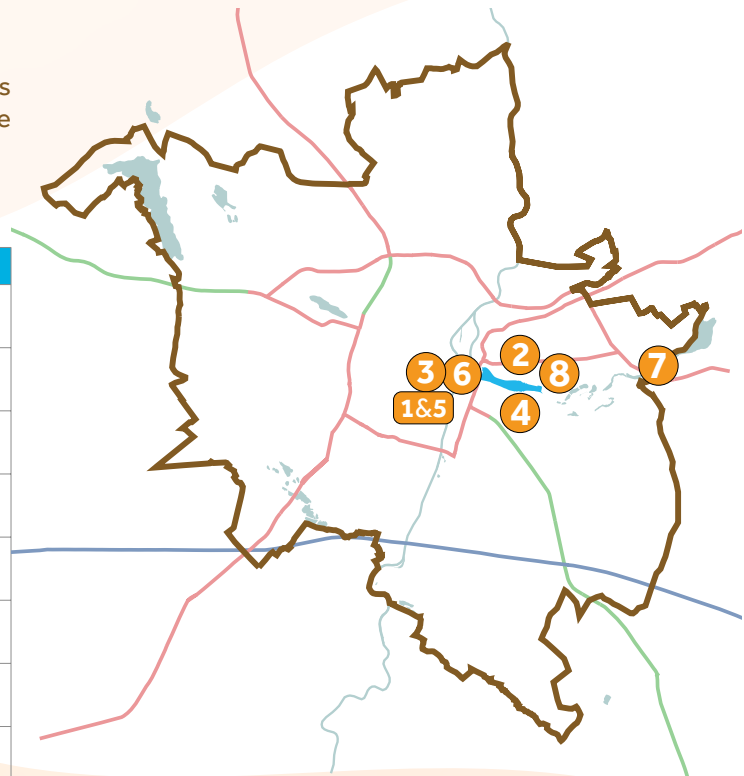

PARKING FOR TEAMS

Parking space for teams will be available at the venue. Individual requests should be made using an online booking form available on <https://rowing.poznan.pl>

Obligatory parking pass can be received in Accreditation centre.

Due to limited parking space we recommend to use the official transportation services provided by the Organising Committee.

CATERING INFORMATION

Meal arrangements for teams: the daily accommodation rate per person is on a full board basis and includes breakfast, lunch on the venue or at the hotel and diner at the hotel. The lunches are served as a rule on the venue but teams can change it to the hotel with the notification by 12.00 p.m. the day before.

For example: if the team wants to have the lunch at the hotel on Saturday the Team Manager must inform the OC about the number of lunches at the hotel by 12.00 p.m. on Friday.

Additional lunches at the venue can be purchased for **€35** per day, per person, 24 hours in advance (12:00 on the day before) in the accreditation centre – nearby the catering tent.

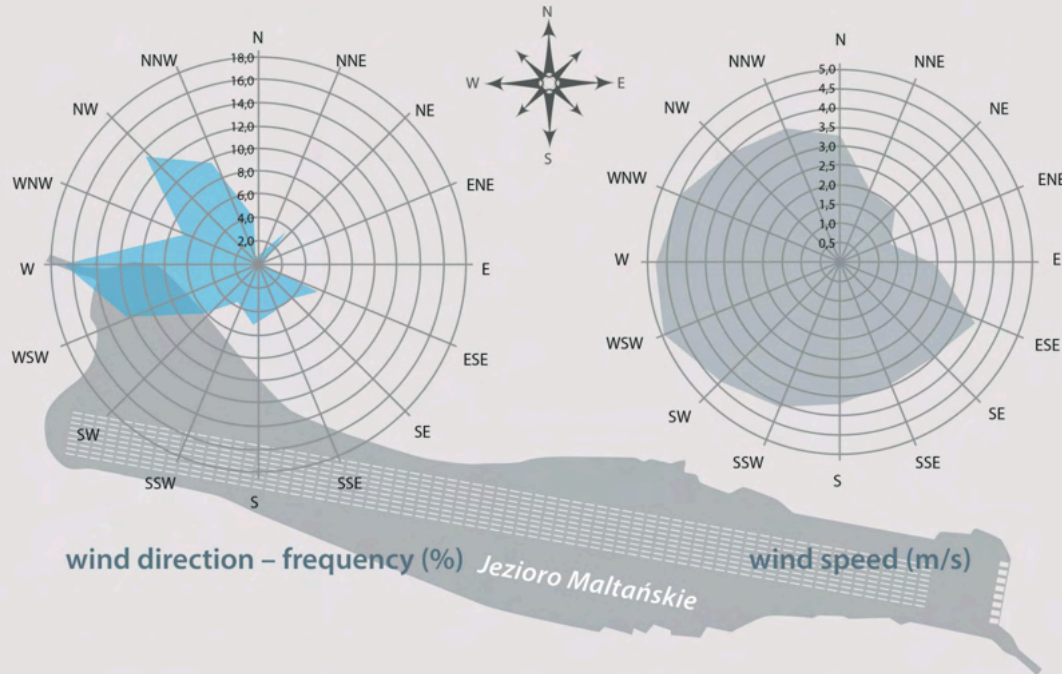

The Presidents' Grandstand is reserved for presidents and secretary-generals of National Rowing Federations. The tickets can be collected from Accreditation Centre.

The General Grandstand and the World Rowing Family Grandstand is ticketed. Please book your ticket in advance via <https://rowing.poznan.pl>

Ticket sale will be also organized at the Accreditation Centre and on the public entrance to the General Grandstands area.

If you have a day-off and you would like to spend this time away from the city we have prepared four ideas of 1-day trips to the city-neighbourhoods.

Gniezno

A popular nickname for Gniezno is that "Poland began here." Although it competes with Poznań for this title, it cannot be denied that it was in Gniezno that the coronations of the first kings of Poland took place. The mortal remains of Saint Adalbert - the patron saint of Poland are also buried here.

A must-see is, of course, is the cathedral, which history goes back more than 1,000 years. It was here, where the kings of the Piast dynasty received their crowns from the hands of the archbishop. You must also see the famous Gniezno Doors, which are a priceless piece of Romanesque art. More historical and archeological treasures can be seen in the nearby museum.

Then we recommend taking a walk around the city. Going along the promenade you will reach the old market square, the Gothic parish church and the Franciscan monastery – all worth visiting. Your trail will be marked by rabbit figurines, scattered throughout the city. Each tells a small part of the history of Gniezno and its past and present inhabitants.

Gniezno can be reached by train in 30-45 minutes.

Wolsztyn

You can also easily reach Wolsztyn by train (it will take a little over an hour), but how could it be otherwise since this city is famous for one of the last active steam locomotive depots in Europe, which has been operating here for over 100 years. Trains with a steam locomotive run regularly from here and anyone can go on such a retro journey.

If you have more time, it is worth taking a walk around the center of Wolsztyn to appreciate this charming town. A local open-air museum is a place frozen in time, showing the life of the inhabitants of

Wielkopolska, as it was some 150-200 years ago. From the open-air museum to the market square there is a lakeside promenade, which you can also cycle around. And if you feel fancy you may also... grab a kayak and go across the lakes.

Two local museums are also worth visiting. One is devoted to the life and work of the sculptor Marcin Rožek, while the other was set up in the home and laboratory of Robert Koch - Nobel Prize winner and author of groundbreaking research on diseases.





Jarocin

The journey by train to Jarocin will take less than an hour. For the generation that grew up in the 1980s and 1990s in Poland, this town is clearly associated with the most important rock festival of that era. No wonder that this sentiment and rock atmosphere are common in Jarocin to this day.



Your first stop should be the Spichlerz Polskiego Rocka, where on three floors of multimedia exhibition you will bring back music and culture from several decades ago. The route then leads through the city, dotted with murals, many of which were commissioned by renowned street artists. Jarocin also probably has the only in the world monument of a bover boot (pl: glan), which is an indispensable attribute of every punk.

Of course, there are also quieter and less rebellious places. After a thorough renovation, the palace of the Radolinski family (today seat of a museum) and the recently renovated market square with an interesting town hall and a church standing nearby. On hot summer days it is best to seek shelter from the heat in a large city park.

Wielkopolska National Park

Poznań enjoys the unique privilege of being only half an hour away from the nearest national park. The Wielkopolska National Park is an all-in-one-place typical landscape of the region. Its entire area was shaped by a glacier about 12,000 years ago, which left behind deep valleys, numerous lakes and picturesque hills. Most of the place is covered with forest, densely intersected with hiking and cycling trails.

You can reach the Wielkopolska National Park by train (to Mosina or Puszczykówko stations), but in this situation the trip will be longer and more demanding. If you only have a few hours and don't want to get too tired, a car will be a more convenient solution. There are plenty of parking lots for tourists in the park.

The most beautiful views can be admired in the vicinity of Osowa Góra, on the shores of Lake Kocietek and on Lake Góreckie. The latter features the Castle Island, whose name comes from the romantic ruins of the castle, perfectly visible from a view point on the shore.
